Warm greetings,

I write to you with a heart full of hope and urgency, trusting this message finds you in a moment of care and reflection. My name is Fergus Harlow, and I am the director of UseYourFreedom.org—a global campaign dedicated to securing the release of Aung San Suu Kyi, Burma's democratically elected leader and Nobel Peace Laureate, along with President Win Myint and more than 22,000 prisoners of conscience, currently held under one of the most brutal military dictatorships of our time.

For years, I've worked side by side with Alan Clements—author, investigative journalist, and lifelong champion of Burma's nonviolent revolution. You may know Alan through his decades of dharma-driven activism, his time as a Buddhist monk at the Mahāsi Meditation Centre, or his decades-long deep friendship with Aung San Suu Kyi, reflected in works like *The Voice of Hope* and our co-authored four-volume epic, *Burma's Voices of Freedom*.

Today, I reach out not just with words, but with a personal, heartfelt invitation to stand with us in a moment that could change history.

We are at a crossroads in Myanmar—the most critical juncture since their nationwide democracy movement began in 1988. Aung San Suu Kyi, now 80, has endured over twenty years in detention, the last five in solitary confinement in a windowless, ratinfested cell in Naypyidaw, Myanmar's military stronghold. Her son has heard nothing from her in years. No proof of life has been shared. Following the devastating earthquake in central Myanmar on March 28th, credible reports from the Suu

Foundation and her legal team in Paris suggest she was injured, her cell damaged. Her fate remains unknown, and our hearts ache with the weight of her suffering.

We cannot stand by. We must act—now—while her light still burns. More than ever, the people of Burma need to know that they have not been forgotten.

In this moment of crisis, Alan Clements, despite being engaged in his own profound health challenges, has poured his soul into a singular act of creative defiance: a breathtaking new work, *Conversation with a Dictator: A Challenge to the Authoritarian Assault.* This 492-page illustrated novel is a fearless excavation of dictatorship, a tribute to Aung San Suu Kyi's unyielding spirit, and a global call to awaken the conscience of humanity.

This is no ordinary book. It is a beacon of hope, a weapon of peace, a love letter to freedom. Woven with over 300 full-page illustrations drawn from 200 years of Burmese history and Alan's 45 years of intimate connection to the country—marked by expulsions, a seventeen-year ban, and friendships with Burma's most courageous leaders—it is a cinematic meditation on power, truth, and redemption.
